Apostolate for Food Banks: Please bring can goods (the Pop-Top kind only) to our monthly gatherings. We will collect these and distribute to one of our local parishes who have food distribution to the poor.

Apostolate for Homeless: Please bring items to pass to the homeless at the breakfast at Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine. Needed are: SOCKS, Hats, Gloves, Scarfs. **Another Apostolate:** At Our Lady of Guadalupe Shrine, Br. Joseph's Franciscan Outreach Ministry is at work every week usually in the mornings around 8:00am. We can try to help in the kitchen during the week to help Br. Joseph.

They serve M-F around 9:30- 12. They start cooking around 8:30 on Monday and Friday. The Minister of St. Francis Fraternity has been working there. She indicates that the same folks seem to eat there most days. She visits with the people as they eat and recommends this as a good outreach to the homeless of San Antonio.

Right to Life Rosaries: A friend of one of our members has donated three Right to Life Rosaries. Each is a gorgeous rosary with remembrances of the value of a developing human life in each decade. We will raffle these off with sales of chances for \$100 at our Christmas gathering and at the Election in early 2025.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

159. Why is the Church called the temple of the Holy Spirit?

She is so called because the Holy Spirit resides in the body which is the Church, in her Head and in her members. He also builds up the Church in charity by the Word of God, the sacraments, the virtues, and *charisms*. *"What the soul is to the human body, the Holy Spirit is to the members of Christ, that is, the body of Christ, which is the Church."* (Saint Augustine) *Further reading:* CCC 797-798, 809-810

160. What are charisms? Charisms are special gifts of the Holy Spirit which are bestowed on individuals for the good of others, the needs of the world, and in particular for the building up of the Church. The discernment of charisms is the responsibility of the Magisterium. *Further reading:* CCC 799-801

161. Why is the Church one? The Church is one because she has as her source and exemplar the unity of the Trinity of Persons in one God. As her Founder and Head, Jesus Christ re-established the unity of all people in one body. As her soul, the Holy Spirit unites all the faithful in communion with Christ. The Church has but one faith, one sacramental life, one apostolic succession, one common hope, and one and the same charity. *Further reading:* CCC 813-815, 866

162. Where does the one Church of Christ subsist? The one Church of Christ, as a society constituted and organized in the world, subsists in (*subsistit in*) the Catholic Church, governed by the Successor of Peter and the bishops in communion with him. Only through this Church can one obtain the fullness of the means of salvation since the Lord has entrusted all the blessings of the New Covenant to the apostolic college along whose head is Peter. *Further reading:* CCC 816, 870

163. How are non-Catholic Christians to be considered? In the churches and ecclesial communities which are separated from full communion with the Catholic Church, many elements of sanctification and truth can be found. All of these blessings come from Christ and lead to Catholic unity. Members of these churches and communities are incorporated into Christ by Baptism and so we recognize them as brothers. *Further reading:* CCC 817-819, 870
